- The SCP/ TSP cell organizes various training programmes for the students including coaching classes for KAS/ IAS/IPS/ UGC-CSIR/ NET/ K-SET/ KPSC/ Banking examinations etc. The cell also provides books to the departments under SC/ ST book bank scheme. The cell encourages research and learning to the students by providing research fellowships and laptops and also provides startup research grants to faculty.
- Social Welfare Officer-Liaising Social Welfare Department for the benefit of students.
- University has various Chairs to encourage research and societal development through study centers linked to Chairs.
- University inculcates wisdom by celebrating all the important events of national and global significance like Environmental day, Science day, International Yoga day, Birthdays of social and scientific thinkers etc.

WEAKNESSES:

- Not enough highly talented students with critical thinking and analyzing skills are getting attracted towards higher education.
- University has space constraints with respect to administrative set up, departmental setup and even library.
- Space, infrastructure and acceptability of current technology must be improved.
- Staff strength is not as per the UGC norms and must be improved.
- Research infrastructure to support research must be improved.
- Placement cell needs improvement.
- Transnational Research should be encouraged by interacting with industry.

OPPORTUNITIES:

- WiFi campus.
- Location of the city and University happens to be a greatest opportunity as Tumkur is an industrial hub.

- CBCS based PG programmes give opportunity to enhance learning in allied or different domains.
- Students have great opportunity to learn and do research as many research institutes of national and global significance located in Bengaluru are approachable.
- Tumkur is an industrial corridor, a large number of industries has been set up and huge numbers of industries are expected too, which provides ample opportunity to the students (stake holders) of Tumkur University.
- Besides Tumkur being an industrial hub, the entire Dabaspeta industrial area (20 Km from Tumkur), Nelamangala Industrial hub (40 Km from Tumkur) and Peenya Industrial hub, Bengaluru (60 Km from Tumkur) are easily accessible.
- National/ International Conferences, symposia and workshops occur on regular basis that provide opportunity to both teachers and students to interact with the researchers.

THREATS:

- Growing industry may reduce the enrolment to post graduation and research.
- The growing industry may pose threat to attract and retain serious research scholars for Ph.D.
- Students with critical thinking capabilities are very rare. Therefore in future, attracting good research scholars may be difficult.

- University is initiating 10 new PG programmes from 2020-21 onwards besides the existing 25 departments that provide PG and Ph.D. programmes.

- Conducted workshop on e-administrative reforms (comprised) to non-teaching staff.

c. ADMINISTRATIVE AND ACADEMIC REFORMS USHERED IN – BASED ON NAAC PEER TEAM RECOMMENDATIONS AND ADMINISTRATIVE AND ACADEMIC AUDIT (AAA) COMMITTEE REPORTS

Tumkur University has been reviewed by the NAAC Peer Team visit from February February 20th to 22nd, 2021 and the university has received a B+ rating on re-evaluation.

d. ADMINISTRATIVE MEASURES FOR NETWORKING AND DEVELOPMENT OF PG CENTERS/ ADDITIONAL CAMPUSES, ON PAR WITH MAIN CAMPUS.

Tumkur University is situated in Tumkur city. In addition to the city campus, the Government has sanctioned 240.10 acres of land at Bidarekatte in order to develop a new campus. At present, series of constructions are going on at new campus including Hostels (Men, Women and Research Scholars), Kalabhavan, Pre-Examination Coaching Centre and Main Entrance. In addition, the University has established a PG Centre at Tiptur to offer M.Com Course. In order to look after the Centre, the University has appointed a Coordinator.

Centre of Excellence building has been built with a grant of 2.79 crores released by the Government of Karnataka for the Postgraduate Center at Sira.

e. PROMOTION OF IMPACT DRIVEN AND SOCIALLY RELEVANT RESEARCH (PH.D., TOPICS, PROJECTS PROPOSED TO FUNDING AGENCIES, RESEARCH PUBLICATIONS, INTER-DISCIPLINARY RESEARCH AND EXTENSION ACTIVITIES)

The University has taken necessary action to take-up the socially relevant research topics as well as projects by the faculty members and research scholars. In addition, the University administrative wings motivate the faculty members to write projects on socially relevant projects in order to get the funds from various funding agencies.

The faculty of Science has started an Incubation Center for the demonstration of sustainable agricultural practices and most of the Ph.D. theses fall under this category where we try to address social issues namely: drought, crop improvement and other pathological disorders including cancer, diabetes and lung problems.

The faculty and research scholars of the Social Science faculty has been working on various themes and issues which bear direct relevance to current socio-political, socio-economic and cultural developments in both historical and sociological contexts as well as multi-disciplinary perspectives.

f. PROMOTION OF EXCELLENCE IN HIGHER EDUCATION

Tumkur University has taken a lot of initiatives to promote excellence in Higher Education including research, curricula development and extension. The syllabus of different faculty has been revised as per the UGC Regulations, in tune with the job market. Each department of the University has conducted symposia/ conference /workshop/ special lecturers in order to inculcate professional ethics.

Academic and Administrative Audit has been done for the first time. Based on the observations given by the AAA Committee, the University has taken all necessary steps to improve the academic and administrative systems.

To increase the GER, the University has introduced five new courses: Biotechnology, Psychology, Journalism & Mass Communication, MCA and Organic Chemistry. The University has also increased intake for a few Departments.

The University has received the RUSA funds which has helped a lot for the faculty members, students and research scholars, focusing on ICT services.

To promote excellence in higher education, IQAC in particular has conducted workshops on Research Productivity, Innovation in Mobile applications, capacity buildings workshops on Change Management and Innovations for the faculty. In addition, IQAC has conducted workshop on NAAC new methodology and preparation of SSR.

To improve the research productivity of the faculty members, the University through IQAC has sanctioned start-up grants for 20 faculty members.

g. INITIATIVES TAKEN TO PROMOTE OVERALL DEVELOPMENT OF THE UNIVERSITY

- ❖ Tumkur University has established/ renovated several research/ students labs. The University has taken initiation to establish smart classrooms as per the directions from the Government through RUSA.
- ❖ The University is constructing academic buildings at new campus located at Bidarekatte, 20 kms from the existing city campus.
- ❖ The University has started five new PG courses - Biotechnology, Psychology, Journalism & Mass Communication, MCA and Organic Chemistry to enhance the innovative learning and job demands. Tumkur University has introduced vocational courses B.Voc in Hardware Technology & Networking as per the UGC guidelines. The Centre has been utilizing this fund for the benefit of the students and the faculty. It has been involving women both within the campus and outside, and enriching knowledge by taking up innovative initiatives. Equipping the students with right knowledge, empowering them with right spirit and educating them to face the challenges of life is the 'moto' of the Centre.

Since higher education is in a most complex situation today and social sciences are at stake, it is essential to bring to the fore front women's issues by debating, discussing, deliberating and documenting issues of concern pertaining to women in Tumakuru District in particular and Karnataka in general.

At present, 166 posts are vacant which include both promotional and posts reserved for 371(J). Apart from the vacant posts, 62 temporary employees are working against the vacant posts with consolidated pay. Tumkur University has taken initiatives to fill the vacant posts as per the Government directions.

c. CAMPUS SECURITY (MAIN AND OTHER CAMPUSES)

Campus Security is Provided by hiring security personals through security agencies fixed on out source basis by calling tenders. At present 33 guards and 2 Supervisors are working in 11 locations in 3 shifts at the campus. Wages are paid as per the rules and regulations of Labour Department Government of Karnataka.

Human Resource Development Section is an integral section of the University; it extends services related to the recruitment of teaching and nonteaching staff based on the parameters notified by the UGC and Government of Karnataka. The Recruitment and Promotions of the staff are as per the roster system in vogue. The fixation of pay, sanction of annual increments, re-imbursement of medical

expenses, maintenance of service registers, framing of statutes related to recruitment, absorption, etc... are followed according to rules framed by the UGC and Government of Karnataka.

The fund for faculty members to present their research/papers in national/ international seminars/ workshops/conferences is allotted by the University as per its budget. The University is maintaining Health Centre, Post Office, Bank and other allied facilities for the welfare of the teaching and nonteaching staff within the campus.

d. SUPPORT TO SLOW LEARNERS (COACHING CLASSES)

The University has taken measures in identifying the slow learners, based on their performance in interactive classes and internal assessment. Staff members of different faculty are conducting regular coaching and remedial classes on a weekly basis. In addition, the faculty members are engaging special classes and tutorials for slow learners to understand their problems in learning and helping them understand the concepts.

e. ENCOURAGEMENT TO ADVANCED LEARNERS:

Various Departments of the Tumkur University have evolved their own vibrant mechanisms for student assessment and adoption of remedial measures to assist the students who are facing constraints in learning. The system of Continuous Internal Assessment through tests, seminars, assignments, classroom discussions, and presentations allows teachers to monitor and assess the progress of students. This system also helps the students to get a feedback on their progress mid-course so that they can work towards improvement.

Based on their performance, the students are advised and encouraged to attend tutorial classes that are included in the teaching schedules. These tutorials provide an opportunity to both the advanced and slow learners to meet faculty members for individual- or smaller group-based learning sessions. Such sessions facilitate adherence to high standards of teaching- learning, academic rigor and even skill enhancement.

Special classes are also organised by many departments to address specific needs of advanced and slow learners. Weekly discussions and visual demonstrations also contribute to student learning outside the classroom. Some departments also organize special programmes for the students on motivation, leadership training, confidence-building, mental health and life skills.

In addition, senior students/research scholars or individual faculty members are assigned as mentors to students to help them to cope with their studies and even problems in their personal domain which impact their overall performance/well-being. Departments such as MSW and MBA also have designated student counselors among faculty members who interact with, and assist students in both professional and personal matters, so that they do not lose focus and are able to improve their academic standards.

Furthermore, student participation in the annual cultural and academic festivals showcase the talents of the advanced learners in academic and co-curricular events like Science quiz, debate, etc., and under the domain of "Good Practices" among others. In addition, exceptional talents in the domains of art, dance, music, and other performing arts are also nurtured and exhibited.

In contrast, advanced learners are encouraged to take up competitive exams like NET/ SLET/KAS/ IAS/ IPS/ IRS/ IFS as well as entrance examination conducted by the National Institutes/ Government Departments/ various sectors. They are also encouraged to be a part of journal club/ discussion forum/ debate. Students are given assignments to engage in critical/ logical thinking. The University faculty members by using the following themes, encourage the advanced learners:

- Making students learn how to do inter-disciplinary thinking
- Understanding students as knowledge-makers and therefore teaching knowledge-making skills and scholarship skills
- Focus on 21st century skills--critical thinking, computing skills and mathematical reasoning
- Focus on ethical learning and rational choices

f. SCHOLARSHIPS, FREE-SHIPS, PRIZES AND OTHERS

g. FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE FOR STUDENT RESEARCH :

The University is providing Rs. 8000/ month scholarship to Research Scholars belonging to Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribe to do their Ph.D. The University is also providing free laptops to the research scholars and master degree students belonging to SC/ST under SCP and TSP programmes.

h. ARRANGEMENT WITH INDUSTRY / INSTITUTIONS FOR INTERNSHIP/ TRAINING/ EDUCATIONAL VISITS :

As a part of the existing PG-CBCS regulations of the University, the students of different PG degrees have visited various industries/educational institutions to attain updated knowledge in their respective subjects.

The University has provided funds for various departments to conduct study tours/ industrial visits/ research institutes to attain updated knowledge in their respective fields.

The University has registered the two constituent colleges of the University and twenty affiliated Colleges under the Karnataka Chief Minister's Kalyan Vikas Yojana for providing skilled higher education and these colleges are being identified as training centers.

The University has signed an agreement with ASSOCHAM, to identify skills of the market, and organize entrepreneurship and skill development training for the university students.

Tumkur University has permitted Tumkur Human Resource Forum, Tumkur Management Association and also initiated student chapter of National Institute of Personnel Management to conduct their regular activities inside the campus to increase Industry-Institution collaboration, which helps for educational visits, internship, field work, block placement and finally job placement.

Tumkur University placement cell has been actively engaged in organizing job fairs in collaboration in District Skill Department and District administration.

Intel Semiconductor Ltd (US) is supporting Tumkur University to develop and implement Intel Atom based embedded curriculum in PG and Diploma Courses for the benefit of non-Engineering Students.

The faculty of Tumkur University has joint participation in Research Projects, International Projects of cooperation of Institutional Collaboration, Seminars and Academic related activities including Exchange of scholars, information, documentation, and scientific publications.

Sera Jey Monastic University is building intellectual and research capacity among the social science students of Tumkur University.

m. FACILITIES TO INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS

Tumkur University has all the facilities for the International students. However, no students have been admitted to the University.

n. DISABLED (DIVYANGIN) FRIENDLY MEASURES (DISABILITY ACT, 2016)

As per the decision of Hon'ble Supreme Court of India and The Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act 2016, Tumkur University is providing 5% reservation of seats in all disciplines. Along with the University has made provision for accessibility as well as facilities to the Disabled (Divyangin). In addition, the University is providing adequate facilities to Pedagogy (Teaching Aids).

o. GRIEVANCE REDRESSAL MECHANISMS

Tumkur University has established Student Grievance Redressal Cell. Dr. C. Shobha, Assistant Professor, Department of Commerce is working as Nodal Officer of the Cell. The Cell has received 12 complaints during 2020-21 from students and scholars

of different Colleges affiliated to Tumkur University. All the complaints have been addressed. Circulars have been sent to all the PG Departments, Constituent and Affiliated Colleges of Tumkur University to intimate all the students to make use of the Cell.

p. PLACEMENT CELL AND CAMPUS RECRUITMENT

The University is having Placement Cell. In association with Skill Development, it has organized 'Job Fair' for the benefit of the students and public through Kaushalya Bhagya Scheme. The Placement Cell is providing information regarding job vacancies, recruitment notifications, walk-in-interview as well as job fairs organized by various Organizations through social media. The Skill Development Training Programme in association with the Placement Cell has organized workshop to identify pre-learning under Kaushalya Bhagya Scheme.

Tumkur University Placement Cell participated in Job Fair organized by the Department of Skill Development and Entrepreneurship and Livelihood, Tumkur Zilla Panchayat, District Skill Mission and Employment Office, Tumkur and Chitradurga by providing information to all the UG and PG students. The students of Tumkur University (Constituent / Affiliated Colleges) have got registered during the event and many of them got job offer letters. In the above said event, the Tumkur University placement cell has actively participated and provided information to the job seekers.

q. ENTREPRENEURSHIPS/ INCUBATION CELL

Tumkur University is associated with Tumakuru Smart City Limited in managing the Business Incubation and Innovation Centre. With a view to fulfill its social commitment, the University has already submitted proposals for initiating skill development courses and for establishing a Mini Digital Planetarium on the new campus under the Smart City Project. In our endeavor to promote innovation and self-employment potential among the younger generation, we are offering the expertise of our faculty members to the proposed Incubation and Innovation Centre without any financial commitment from the University.

23. CONVOCATION: CONDUCTED 14TH ANNUAL CONVOCATION

a. DISTINGUISHED INVITEE WHO DELIVERED CONVOCATION ADDRESS AND VICE CHANCELLORS REPORT TO THE CHANCELLOR.

Padma Vibhushan Dr. Krishnaswamy Kasturirangan, Chancellor of Central University of Rajasthan; Former Chairman, ISRO; Chairman, Committee for the Draft National Education Policy and Karnataka Knowledge Commission was the distinguished invitee (Chief Guest) during the 14th Annual Convocation of Tumkur University and delivered the Convocation Address.

The following is the report to His Excellency, the Chancellor by the Vice-Chancellor during the Convocation:

I take pride in extending a warm welcome to Hon'ble Governor of Karnataka and the Chancellor of Tumkur University, Sri Vajubhai Vala Ji to the Fourteenth Annual Convocation of Tumkur University.

I am happy to welcome the Chief Guest for the day, the Chancellor of Central University of Rajasthan; Former Chairman, ISRO; Chairman, Committee for the Draft National Education Policy and Karnataka Knowledge Commission Padma Vibhushan Dr. Krishnaswamy Kasturirangan.

I extend a hearty welcome to Sri I.S. Prasad, who has been recognized by Tumkur University for the conferment of Honoris Causa to acknowledge his service to Society.

I am very pleased to welcome the esteemed members of the Syndicate, Academic Council, Deans, Chairpersons of all Departments, All Members of teaching fraternity, Principals and Representatives of Affiliated Colleges and non-teaching staff of Tumkur University.

I am also delighted to welcome the Members of Legislative Assembly, Legislative Council and Members of the Parliament, Worshipful Mayor, Deputy Commissioner, CEO of Tumkur Zilla Panchayat, Superintendent of Police, Dr. Leena Chandran Wadia and other invitees from the District Administration, parents of graduates, Members of Electronic and Print Media and the other distinguished invitees.

It is a pleasure for me to welcome our graduates who will be receiving their degrees in this Convocation.

Tumkur University, in a short span of 16 years, has been recognized as a significant knowledge corridor for higher learning.

The whole nation today is brimming with the new dimensions being offered to education system of India by the National Education Policy.

Karnataka will be the torchbearer for the entire nation in the implementation of National Education Policy. I assure you that Tumkur University will be the torchbearer for all the Universities in Karnataka in the implementation of National Education Policy.

In fact, we have already integrated the five tenets of the NEP namely equity, accessibility, affordability, quality and accountability into the fabric of our university.

I wish to place special emphasis on the component of "quality" because we have always followed quality as a core principle. This will automatically take care of the component of "accessibility".

The component of “accountability” in terms of our responsibility towards the society is addressed by the research culture of the University.

I want the people of Tumkur to notice that the civic responsibility of the University has been reflected in certain significant research done in the areas of Women Empowerment, eradication of casteism, education, employability and socially relevant scientific research.

Higher education in Tumkur University is affordable even to the economically weakest communities. To name a few, fee for self-financed courses are reduced. Students are allowed to pay their fees in instalments. In this way, the University has addressed the issue of “affordability” through its student-friendly approach.

My firm belief is that real education should lead to higher thinking, which in turn leads to eradication of inequality. By ruling out the boundaries of caste and creed, our university sufficiently addresses the component of “equity”.

We have designed the academic blocks on the new campus in such a way that interconnectivity between academic blocks is facilitated through skywalk. This encourages interdisciplinary, transdisciplinary and boundaryless learning. A student of Arts can study Sciences and Commerce; a student of Commerce can pursue courses in Arts and Science; a student of science stream can study liberal arts and commerce. This is completely in line with the idea of high-quality, holistic and multidisciplinary education as envisaged in the National Education Policy.

As a part of our initiative to implement the NEP, we have conducted a number of webinars on NEP by inviting distinguished resource persons including the members of the drafting committee Dr. M K Sridhar and Dr. Anurag Behar. The Chairman of the drafting committee Dr. Kasturirangan is here with us today.

Let me present a glimpse of the academic profile of the University.

We have 28 postgraduate programmes, 2 constituent colleges and 91 affiliated colleges. In these colleges, there are 33,000 undergraduate and more than 3,000 postgraduate students. I am happy to mention that girl students outnumber boys. Thus, we are ensuring women empowerment. Further, a majority of our students hail from socially marginalized and economically weaker sections. By providing higher education opportunities to them, we are ensuring social justice.

We are gradually expanding our wings. A new PG Centre at Tiptur with M.Com and MCA courses; a new campus at Sira with Mathematics and MBA courses along with a Centre for excellence offering job-oriented short term courses have been established.

I wish to make a special mention here. Tumkur University has set an example for other universities in the extensive use of technology. Even during COVID-19 Pandemic, within a week of announcement of lockdown during March 2020, our teachers quickly shifted their pedagogy from offline to online mode and started engaging classes using technology. Tumkur University, which consists of majority of students hailing from rural areas, did not get deterred by lockdown.

As a matter of fact, there was enthusiastic participation and involvement from the students even in online mode of learning. This was highly appreciated by the Government and other stakeholders. Therefore, I say, COVID Pandemic has, in no way, deterred our teaching and learning endeavours. Rather, it created a space to develop high self-esteem to face any eventuality.

Any university stands for teaching, learning, research, publication and extension.

As a university, we are actively engaged in knowledge generation as well as dissemination. The Prasara brings out two scholarly peer-reviewed journals namely Pragmata in English and Lokajana in Kannada.

A book titled Karunya, the Kannada translation of collection of discourses by His Holiness 14th Dalai Lama originally titled as Kindness, Clarity and Insight has been published last week.

Excellence in higher education is measured by benchmarking and ranking. We believe in achieving excellence through self-assessment and improvement.

The University has undergone the second cycle of accreditation by NAAC and has been awarded with B+ grade. I am happy to bring to your kind notice that the NAAC Peer Team has appreciated the academic ambience prevalent in the campus. I am hopeful of betterment in grading.

Our University has been ranked as a three-star University under Karnataka State Universities Rating Framework (KSURF).

We have also made our mark in NIRF ranking. Despite being a young university, Tumkur University secured has NIRF rank and has been recognized as one among five universities in the state to be ranked in the band of 1-150.

With 588 publications indexed in Scopus and 66 research projects funded by prestigious funding agencies, I am sure we will be recognized as a “research-intensive” university.

The University has established thirteen study chairs in the name of great philosophers, spiritual teachers, reformers, indigenous cultural heroes, poets, writers and litterateurs,

great statesmen, national builders, social thinkers and activists. These study chairs have organized several programmes to inculcate in the students the ideas and ideals of these luminaries.

Dr. B R Ambedkar's vision of a society based on liberty, equality and fraternity is being conceived through a series of programmes organized by Dr. B R Ambedkar Study Centre.

The Centre for Women's Studies focuses on creating awareness among girl students in the areas of gender disparities, gender equality, women empowerment and feminist thinking.

As a measure to empower and enhance the skills of socially marginalized communities, we are providing PhD Fellowships, dissertation cost reimbursement, scholarships and hostel Facilities to SC/ST students and regularly conducting training on various skills development programmes.

To augment to the present need, we have conducted several workshops, seminars, conferences, awareness programmes, webinars and special lectures using Zoom, Facebook and other social media platforms to keep students updated of latest trends and developments and achieved excellence ICT in higher education was supposed to achieve in terms of transparency, time saving, and cost effectiveness. I am happy to mention that Tumkur University is bagging first place every year in delivering Sakala Services with high rate of accuracy. Further, we are the first university in the State to implement "Seva Sindhu" online services. Tumkur University has achieved this through digital revolution in spite of several obstacles posed by the Pandemic.

Apart from curricular and co-curricular activities, I am happy to mention that Tumkur University is well-known for its extension activities. Our university is the "brand ambassador" for all the universities in the State in involving extension activities where our teachers and students get direct experience to use as source material to convert classroom into a virtual lab, thereby achieving quality in education.

Our unique extension activities include village adoption, school adoption, and library improvement programmes. Eight villages and ten schools in Tumakuru district have been adopted and 30,000 beneficiaries have been reached.

In the line of the same, to inculcate discipline, sense of civic responsibility and good conduct, our NCC, NSS and Bharat Scouts and Guides and Youth Red Cross units have been working very hard. Our NCC & NSS are par excellence in imbibing good conduct and character in students.

The Vice-Chancellor of Tumkur University was conferred with the rank of Honorary Colonel by the Commandant of NCC, Government of India and Deputy Director-General, NCC Directorate, Karnataka and Goa States. The Vice-Chancellor of Tumkur University is

the only Vice Chancellor from Karnataka and Goa States to be conferred with this honour in the past seven years.

The University NCC Officer Dr. D B Aruna Kumar has won commendation from the Deputy Director-General, NCC Directorate, Karnataka and Goa States. NCC Cadets have participated in state-level and national level RD Parade selection camps and won commendation. NSS wing had organized Swacchata Mission for NSS Programme Officers and International Day against Drug, Abuse and Illicit Trafficking.

Collaboration is the order of the day. Tumkur University has laid special emphasis on collaboration. The university has entered into MoU with FDR Focus Group, Lead India Foundation, USA; RFRF, Nagpur, and CESS, Bengaluru. Shortly, we will enter into an MoU with University of Salford, UK.

We have successfully implemented Public Fund Management System for centralized payments and HRMS for the payment of salary for the teaching and the non-teaching staff.

The University Library has been enriched by procuring resources at a cost of Rs 80 lakhs under RUSA funds. About 1.5 crores have been allocated from RUSA grants to build a well-equipped multi-gym on the campus.

The University has lent a helping-hand to the needy during COVID-19 Pandemic by contributing about 5,000 food kits to people affected by lockdown, and 1,50,000 energy drinks to COVID warriors across Karnataka. Further, the teachers, non-teaching staff and students collected funds and donated it to people affected by lockdown.

The Development of new campus of the University at Bidarakatte is fast progressing. Construction of SC/ST Hostels for boys & girls, SC/ST Research Scholars Hostel, and Boys' Hostel under RUSA Grants are on the verge of completion.

Construction of Sub-Regional Science Centre for Karnataka Science and Technology Promotion Society, Kala Bhavan, Pre-examination training centre, a beautiful road, main entrance gate and an academic block is in progress. Apart from this, 25 acres of land has been earmarked for the PG centre at Tiptur. The Centre for Excellence building at Sira is ready for inauguration.

I hope our next Convocation will be on new campus provided some uncertainties go off and provision is made. I wish to take this opportunity to thank the Government of Karnataka and my staff members for their support and cooperation. I am hopeful that our next annual report shall contain equally progress-oriented statistics.

C. IMPACTING GOVERNANCE POLICIES AT STATE/ NATIONAL/ INTERNATIONAL CONTEXTS

D. NEW MODULES FOR SOCIALLY RELEVANT EXTENSION ACTIVITIES:

The faculty and research scholars of Tumkur University have been working on various socio-economic, socio-political issues. The Department of Social Work has adopted five villages in Tumkur District jurisdiction to improve the socio-economic and socio-political issues of the adopted villages. The NSS Unit of Tumkur University has organized several camps to educate the villagers to know about lifestyle disorders (Diabetes, CVD, Snakebite Management, Malnutrition), savings, hygienic, government schemes etc... In addition, the University has taken initiation to promote literacy among the most backward and downtrodden section of the society. The faculty members of the University has visited taluk/ hobli/ panchyath to create awareness about the courses offered by the University in order to improve the GER.

The Department of Studies and Research in Social Work of Tumkur University has established a Community Development Centre to adopt villages for rural development programs in collaboration with the rural community at University new campus. Objectives of adopting the villages are to increase the quality of education, to empower the socio-economic conditions and solve the problems of the villages and suggest the best possible solution for their problems.

As per the Order of the Governor, Government of Karnataka, Tumkur University has expanded the activities of the Community Development Center to the university's new campus which has been set up at Bidarakatte Village in Galigenahalli Gram Panchayat. In addition, Tumkur University has adopted five villages Bidarakatte, Mudigere, Dommnakuppe, Gollarahatti, and Menasandra in the jurisdiction of Galigenahalli Gram Panchayat.

We, at Tumkur University, have wrestled with these challenging times by successfully creating online learning environment. We, first, motivated the Principals and teachers of all the affiliated colleges and ensured the effective implementation of teaching and learning process online for the undergraduate students. On our own campus, we made the maximum use of digital technology in reaching out to our students across disciplines, besides conducting online academic events like webinars.
